The New York Giants get permission to relocate from New York to San Francisco. CBS airs a documentary on the Cuban revolution containing an interview with rebel Fidel Castro. In Washington, D.C., President Eisenhower meets with Vietnamese President Ngo Dinh Diem and pledges to resist communism. In Tokyo, Japanese demonstrators protest at the British Embassy against nuclear testing.

The Milwaukee Braves defeat the New York Yankees in the seventh game to win the World Series. Fans chase the New York Giants, stealing souvenirs, as they move to California. The Detroit Lions defeat the Chicago Bears for the NFL title. Althea Gibson wins her first women's singles title at Wimbledon; Lewis Hoad wins his second men's title. Boston, coached by Red Auerbach, beats out St. Louis to become NBA champs. Iron Liege, ridden by Willie Shoemaker, wins the Kentucky Derby. Heavyweight boxing champ Floyd Patterson continues to reign with two KO's: Hurricane Jackson and Pete Rademacher.
